MINUTES

The Carlynton School District Board of Education held its regular voting meeting July 16, 2018 in the Rosslyn Farms Community Center. Board President Jim Schriver, Vice President Joe Appel, Treasurer Marissa Mendoza, and Directors George Honchar, LeeAnne O'Brien, David Roussos, and Christine Simcic were present for the meeting. Also present were Superintendent Gary Peiffer, Solicitor Bill Andrews, Director of Fiscal Affairs Chris Juzwick, Principals Marsha Burleson and Rachel Gattuso, Curriculum and Data Coordinator Ed Mantich, Director of Special Education Rachel Andler, and Director of Technology Joe Rodella. One individual and one member of the press rounded out the audience.

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u> - President Schriver called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. Chris Juzwick led the pledge. The roll was called by Catherine Kovach. Directors Richardson and Zaletski were absent.

PUBLIC COMMENT ON BUSINESS BEFORE THE BOARD: None

<u>PRESENTATION</u>: A representative from PSDLAF (Pennsylvania School District Liquid Asset Fund), discussed how the district can invest and explained the low level of risk based on the law. He finished by answering general questions from the board.

- Executive Session President Schriver said personnel items were discussed in the closed session.
- Administrative Reports
 - Superintendent's Report Dr. Peiffer said it is hot at the high school while the new HVAC system is installed. He said good progress has been made and the air should be on by the time teachhers return in August. The district welcomed students from South Africa; he arranged for them to visit the best of Pittsburgh and they had a wonderful time.
 - <u>Business/Finance</u> Mr. Juzwick said it is important to continue monitoring the cash flow in order to maximize the district's investments.

- Special Education and Pupil Services Dr. Andler said they closed out the 2017-2018 school year and a special education boot camp will be held August 14. Camp Aim's session at Carnegie Elementary went well and may be considered again for next year.
- Curriculum and Data Mr. Mantich distributed data related to the Keystone Exams and explained the process of reaching proficiency. The state continues to push back the date for mandatory testing as a graduation requirement. Mr. Mantich also discussed trends for the PSSA exam and Scholars classes.
- Maintenance Mr. McDade said the HVAC project is ongoing with much to do before the school year begins. The high school is 70 percent clean and the LED lighting is 80 percent completed. It has been a busy summer with work to electrical, plumbing and replacement of the switch gear. Concrete work to sidewalks has been completed and asphalt resealing is scheduled. Many areas at Crafton Elementary were painted, carpeting was cleaned or installed, and landscaping was completed. Carnegie Elementary has received much of the same and looks good. The pool at the high school will be drained for a repair before school begins.
- Technology Mr. Rodella said they have been refreshing or replacing old computers and reimagining machines. He is trying to cycle out old computers on a three-year rotation. The copiers and printers are now programmed with Papercut and it will monitor copies and printing with the goal of cutting costs and prompting black/white printing versus color. Phones have been installed in every elementary classroom and security cameras are working in all schools. He is hoping to replace tube TVs in classrooms and allow morning announcements to be streamed on YouTube.
- Principals Mrs. Gattuso reviewed the revisions to the student handbook and announced an orientation will be held for seventh graders on August 8 at 6 pm. Scheduling for students is on target and will be mailed out by end of the week.
